Scholarship Description Master Document

The following scholarships are selected by a volunteer committee of Cumberland Community Foundation, Inc.

C.G. Avent, Jr. and Amelia P. Avent Memorial Scholarship

One renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,200 in 2005; \$1,200 in 2006

Created in loving memory of C.G. Avent, Jr., and Amelia P. Avent to honor their contributions to the education of our youth.

Awarded annually to a deserving student who could not otherwise attend college and who will attend either Fayetteville State University (Fayetteville, NC) or Johnson C. Smith University (Charlotte, NC).

To qualify you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page and plan to attend either of the universities listed above. Students with financial need will have priority.

Additional materials required for application –

Short essay: Using 200 words or less, describe yourself, your plans for the future and for reaching your educational/career goals, your strengths and weaknesses and likes and dislikes.

Belk/Dorothy A. Howard Scholarship

One non-renewable award: \$300 in 2004; \$300 in 2005; \$500 in 2006

To qualify you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page and you must be a female planning to major in education or an education-related field at a North Carolina university or college. Financial need is considered in selection. Competitive applicants have strong academic records and religious affiliations.

Reverend Henry Hudson Bobbitt Scholarship

One non-renewable award: \$1,200 in 2005; \$1,200 in 2006

Annual award created in loving memory of Reverend Henry Hudson Bobbitt to make college education accessible to members of Mt. Sinai Missionary Baptist Church in Fayetteville, NC. Students will be selected based on financial need, academic achievement and citizenship.

To qualify you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page and be an active member in Mt. Sinai Missionary Baptist Church in Fayetteville, NC. Students with financial need will have priority.

Additional materials required for application –

Short essay: Using 200 words or less, describe how this scholarship will help you achieve your goals.

Anthony G. Chavonne Scholarship

One non-renewable award: \$1,250 in 2005; \$1,200 in 2006

This award was created in honor of the employees of *The Fayetteville Observer* to make a college education accessible to the children and grandchildren of employees of *The Fayetteville Observer*.

To qualify for this award you must:

- meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page except Cumberland County residency is not required,

- have parents or grandparents who are employed by The Fayetteville Publishing Company at the time of application,
- have a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 2.5, and
- be a high school senior or full time college student.

Financial need is a consideration in selection.

Additional materials required for application:

Proof of parent or grandparent's employment at The Fayetteville Publishing Company.

Short essay: Using 200 words or less, describe how this scholarship will help you achieve your goals.

Booker T. and Juanita E. Coley Scholarship

One renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,250 in 2005; not awarded in 2006

Created in loving memory of Booker T. Coley and Juanita Coley to honor their contributions to the education of our youth.

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page, demonstrated financial need, enrolling as a full-time student at Fayetteville State University; have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (B) or better; examples and personal and/or professional references which substantiate that you possess strong character, work ethic and religious beliefs. Priority will be given to students graduating from E.E. Smith High School or students who will study elementary education.

Additional materials required for application:

Short essay - In 200 words or less discuss your character and work ethic using examples to illustrate your points and the impact of your religious beliefs on your life.

William W. Crowell Scholarship – Not available due to renewal.

One renewable award: \$700 in 2004; \$850 in 2005; \$1,250 in 2006

For students of families engaged in the fields of engineering or construction from eastern North Carolina who are entering institutions of higher learning to study any field.

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page, live in eastern North Carolina and have a parent employed in construction or engineering. Financial need is considered in selection.

Additional materials required for application:

Proof of parent's employment in the field of construction or engineering.

Short essay: Describe yourself using 100 words or less including your plans for the future, strengths and weaknesses; likes and dislikes. Describe your plans for reaching your educational and career goals. Explain why you do or do not work.

Cumberland Retired School Personnel Scholarship

One renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,200 in 2005; \$1,200 in 2006

To qualify for this award you must be a rising college sophomore, junior, or senior, enrolled at an accredited institution of higher learning in North Carolina, and majoring in any field of study. Students from Cumberland County will be given priority.

Additional materials required for application

Answer the following questions:

- Explain the reasons you have selected your chosen vocation.
- Describe your educational and career goals.

Ella Smith Downing Charitable Scholarship

Created in loving memory of Ella Smith Downing (1915-2005) for needy students to attend college.

Renewable

To qualify for this award, you must meet the following criteria:

Updated 3/5/2007

- Live in Cumberland, Robeson, Bladen or Hoke County
- Have financial need
- Attend Methodist University, Duke University, or University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill
- Meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page with the exception of residency

Additional materials required for application:

Short essay:

Ellis-Walker Builders, Inc. Scholarship – Not available due to renewal.

To qualify for this award you must live in eastern North Carolina, meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page, pursue a degree in the field of engineering and have a family member engaged in the field of engineering or construction. Financial need will be considered.

Entre Nous Scholarship Endowment

Renewable: Past winners may reapply on equal footing with other applicants each year.

Created in loving memory of Michelle Jones for the purpose of making a college education accessible to deserving students pursuing a degree in education at Fayetteville State University based on financial need and proven academic effort.

Eligibility: This scholarship is available to students who meet all of these requirements:

- A student at Fayetteville State University who has completed at least two semesters,
- A student with a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5,
- A student who is planning to major in education,
- A student who is planning to teach after graduation.

Priorities: The scholarship selection committee will consider the following priorities equally:

- Students with financial needs not met by other sources,
- Students who have proven their academic achievement.

Additional materials required for application:

Respond to the following questions:

- ***Using 200 words or less, discuss why you have chosen to major in Elementary Education and what or who has influenced you to choose this vocation.***
- ***Describe your unmet financial need and circumstances.***

Fayetteville Firefighters Scholarship for Dependant Children

Renewable on equal footing with other applicants; Renewal applicant must complete a full application.

Awards up to \$2,000; 2 awards of \$2,000 each in 2006

Created to help active uniform Fayetteville firefighters by providing educational scholarships to their dependant children.

To qualify for this award you must be a dependant child of active uniform Fayetteville firefighters and planning to attend an accredited community college, college, or university within six months of the application date.

(Civilian dependant children are not eligible to apply. Dependant must be a legal dependant.) High school seniors and full time college students are eligible to apply.

Award is based on financial need – 20%, academic achievement – 40%, and Citizenship and extracurricular participation – 40%.

Additional materials required for application –

Verification of employment as an active, uniformed Fayetteville firefighter

Short essay: Using 200 words or less, describe how this scholarship will help you achieve your goals.

Fayetteville Firefighters Scholarship Endowment

Renewable on equal footing with other applicants; Renewal applicant must complete a full application.

Awards up to \$1,500; one award in 2006

Created to help active uniform Fayetteville firefighters by providing educational scholarships.

To qualify for this award you must be BOTH an active uniform Fayetteville firefighter AND planning to attend an accredited community college, college, or university within six months of the application date.

Award is based on financial need – 30%, contributions and dedication to the field of firefighting – 30%, citizenship in the community – 20%, and special circumstance – 20%.

Additional materials required –

- SAR – Student Aid Report
- **Short personal statement** - Describe your contributions and dedication to the field of firefighting, your citizenship in the community, and any special circumstances contributing to your need for the scholarship.
- Verification of employment as an active uniform Fayetteville firefighter

John Thomas Gibson Scholarship

Non-renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,184 in 2005; not awarded in 2006

Created in honor of John Thomas Gibson by his daughters to benefit a student from E.E. Smith High School who is like their father. John Thomas Gibson was an honest and hard-working man with a pleasant personality. He was a natural leader who was creative in his approach to problem solving. He was a people-oriented person with a charismatic leadership style. He was an average student with an above average work ethic who took what he had and made the most of his opportunities.

To qualify for this award you must be a graduating senior at E.E. Smith High School in Cumberland County, enrolling at NC A&T in Greensboro, have a GPA of at least 2.5 (C+). Students with financial need will have priority.

Additional materials required for application:

Short essay: Describe your personal qualities, leadership style and abilities and your work ethic. Please cite examples from your life to illustrate your answers.

Dorothy Gilmore FCCYC Scholarship and the Monroe E. Evans Scholarship

Only one application needed per student

Two non-renewable awards: \$2,000 in 2004; \$2,250 in 2005; \$2,200 in 2006

Created by the students, friends and fans of Dorothy Gilmore and Monroe E. Evans to recognize, celebrate and support student leadership in Cumberland County High Schools and to provide financial support for higher education in memory of Dorothy Gilmore and Monroe E. Evans.

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page and have a demonstrated commitment to achieving your own potential academically. You must be a well-rounded leader and have demonstrated the ability to commit to a project and provide the leadership to see it through to successful completion. Financial need will be considered.

Competitive applicants have at least a 3.8 GPA (un-weighted), minimum SAT scores of 1090, rank in the top 5% of their class, have received numerous academic awards and have a strong record of community service throughout

high school on several projects and show a high degree of initiative and responsibility.

Brenda C. McFadyen Scholarship

Two non-renewable awards: \$1,500 in 2004; \$3,000 in 2005; \$3,500 in 2006

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page, have a GPA of 3.0 or better and have demonstrated financial need. Special consideration will be given to children of single parent families.

Gurney and Olive McLaughlin Scholarship

Renewable if certain conditions are met.

Created in honor of Gurney and Olive McLaughlin in order to make a college education accessible to dependant children of military service members with Ft. Bragg as their duty station.

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria (except residency) listed on the scholarship home page, be a high school senior, and meet **one** of the following criteria: a) child of active duty military service members with Ft. Bragg as their duty station; OR b) child of retired military

service member who lives in one of the counties near Ft. Bragg, NC OR c) child who lives in one of the counties near Ft. Bragg, NC who military parent was killed in action. Equal consideration will be given to financial need, academic achievement, and citizenship.

Additional materials required for application:

Submit a written statement of service on official letterhead and signed by the Adjutant, Personnel Officer, XO, or CO of the unit or organization if the parent is active duty **OR** a copy of the DD214 if parent has retired **OR** a death certificate or form 1300 if the parent was killed in action.

Essay: In 200 words or less, respond to the following:

What does my parent's military service mean to me and how has it impacted my future plans?

Pamella S. and Douglas R. Moll Scholarship

Renewability – May reapply if eligible and previous recipients will have priority; will need to complete a full application if you are reapplying.

Awards: amount varies depending on university attending

To qualify for this award, you must be a resident of North Carolina and full-time day student pursuing an undergraduate degree in Elementary Education at Methodist College in Fayetteville, NC; Fayetteville State University in Fayetteville, NC; the University of North Carolina at Pembroke; or St. Andrew's Presbyterian College in Laurinburg, NC. You must have completed 24 credit hours by the end of the semester of application. Freshmen and sophomore applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better. Junior and senior applicants must have cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better to apply. Financial need is considered

Additional materials required for application:

Ellen Koonce Parker Scholarship

One award

The donor wishes to recognize deserving students from Cumberland County and Hoke County who will attend NC State University or Appalachian State University.

To qualify you must be a graduating senior from Cumberland County, NC or Hoke County, NC and plan to attend NC State University or Appalachian State University within six (6) months of the application date.

The selection committee will consider the following priorities equally:

- Academic Merit – measured by a cumulative weighted GPA. Consideration should be given to the difficulty of the course load.
- Leadership/Character/Community Service – Measured by the content of the Recommendation letters, community service records, participation in extra curricular activities, and other areas reflecting Leadership/Character/Community Service.

Financial need is NOT a consideration.

Short Essay: In 100 to 150 words, describe who you are and what you plan to do with your life.

Anne Barnes Sternlicht Scholarship – Not available due to renewal by previous recipient.

One renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$2,650 in 2005; \$2,650 in 2006

To qualify for this award, you must be a graduating senior from Cumberland or Robeson County, NC enrolling as a full-time student at Methodist College. You must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (B) and have demonstrated financial need.

Additional materials required for application:

Short essay: Discuss your academic values, why you want to go to college and your educational and career goals. Discuss how you have shown strong determination in your life. Explain your financial situation and why assistance is necessary.

Curtis E. Torrey Scholarship

One renewable award: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,350 in 2005; \$1,350 in 2006

Created in loving memory of Curtis E. Torrey by his wife, Rosa Lee Torrey.

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page, enroll as a full-time student at Fayetteville State University in Fayetteville, NC, North Carolina A&T in Greensboro, NC or South Carolina State University in Orangeburg, SC, have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (B) or better, demonstrated financial need and strong character and beliefs.

Additional materials required for application:

Short Essay: Using 200 words or less, discuss how your religious beliefs, character and work ethic have been shaped and how they have guided you citing examples. Discuss why you want to go to college and why you think you will graduate.

Walter Lee “Jack” Tucker Scholarship – Not available due to renewal by previous recipients.

Two renewable awards: \$1,000 in 2004; \$1,200 in 2005; \$1,500 in 2006

To qualify for this award you must meet the general eligibility criteria listed on the scholarship home page and be a child of a Fayetteville, NC Fire Department uniformed employee. Financial need is considered.

Proof of parent’s employment with Fayetteville, NC Fire Department.

Competitive applicants for this award have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.85 (un-weighted), rank in the top 5% of their class, have minimum SAT scores of 1100, strong records of extra-curricular and community involvement that includes leadership positions and significant religious affiliation and participation.
