


% Female Racial & Age Composition-Cumberland



Female Racial Composition in Cumberland County




Child Population by Racial Composition



Median Earnings Comparison









Female Educational Attainment by Age Group




% Women receiving prenatal care in 1st trimester 2004-2008




Percent of Birth to mothers who smoked prenatally in Cumberland County: 10.4


Pregnancy Rates girls 15-17 years2004-2008




Low (<=2500gms) and Very Low (<=1500gms)Birth weights



% Low birth weight infants by race 2004-2008




Percentage of Live Births where mother smoked during pregnancy-Trend data




Prevalence of Obesity in Children-2008

• Obese Children ages 2-4






Low Income Childhood Obesity-Cumberland








% Title XIX eligible children receiving dental services-2006


